

BENALLA CEMETTERY

- *1 William Maginnis (1841-1902)
Early flour miller. Died from a fall from the railway Bridge in 1902
- *2 Robert Campbell (1860 -
Train driver whose death in 1894 at Baddaginnie caused a signalling change by Victorian Railways.
- *3 Rev. A. C. McComnan (1857 - 1930)
Presbyterian Minister for 42 years from 1884. McComnan House at the High School was named in his honour.
- *4 Dorothy Floate.
A self taught cook, who won many wards at Shows and wrote cook books including
"Secret to Success."
- *5 George Sharpe. (1822 - 1882)
Built the Commercial Hotel in 1856.
- Benalla's first Shire President.
- *6 William McKellar. (1797 - 1893)
Benalla's first settler in 1839 at "Lima Station".
Died in 1893 aged 96 years.
- *7 Hugh Moodie. (1835 - 1903)
In 1869 conducted a foundry in the town where Carters and Beaurepairs were located.
Died in 1903
- *8 Malcolm McEachern.
Early discoverer of a cure for sheep scab.
Died 1872.
- *9 Rev John Ride. (1789 - 1862)
1st Primitive Methodist minister in Victoria 1850.
Died 1862 aged 73.
- *10 Corporal Sambo. (1825 - 1879)
Native tracker brought from Queensland to track down the Kelly Gang.
- *11 Goon Tack. (1845 - 1880)
A Chinese resident who died at the age of 35.
- *12 George Toey" Palmer. (1859 - 1910)
Australian Test Cricketer in the 1880's.
Died 1910. Restoration of grave in 1999.

HISTORICAL WALK

- *13 Fr. John Lawrence Scanlon. (1846 - 1880)
First Parish Priest at St. Joseph's Church.
Conducted burial of Constable Scanlon.
- *14 Richard Clark. (1817 - 1859)
Benalla's first Publican ran the Black Swan Inn at Arundel Street in 1840. Richard died in 1869.
- *15 William Carpenter Bond (1817 - 1891)
Benalla's first town pound keeper in 1848.
- *16 Joe Byrne. (1857 - 1880)
Member of the Kelly Gang, killed in 1880 at the Glenrowan siege at Jones' Hotel.
- *17 George Edwin Reid. (1852 - 1852) -
Earliest burial 1852, probably moved from Barrack Street Cemetery in 1854.
- *18 Eight Nuns' Grave
The grave site of nuns who died whilst serving at F.C.J.
- *19 Adam Rye. (1820 - 1922)
Aged 102, youngest of a family of 33. Had 263 descendants at the time of his death.
- *20 Jane Lloyd. (1837 - 1904)
Aunt of Ned Kelly.
- *21 Thomas Lloyd. (1837 - 1900)
Uncle of Ned Kelly.
- *22 Mary Ann Quinn nee McCluskey(1799-1894)
Ned Kelly's grandmother who died at Swanpool aged 92.
- *23 Marin Cherry. (1821 - 1880)
A hostage who was killed at Glenrowan siege 1880
- *24 Hon. Willis Little. (1847 - 1917)
Born near Benalla 1847. Early Shire councillor and Member of the Victorian Legislative Council.
- *25 Dr. John Nicholson. (1839 - 1915).
Very civic minded doctor who practised from 1870 to 1914. He died in 1914.
- *26 Dr. Arthur Barrington. (1862 - 1919)
A doctor from 1891 - 1919. Instigated Benalla bows club and President of the Esperanto Club.

MAP OF THE GENERAL & OLD BENALLA CEMETTERY

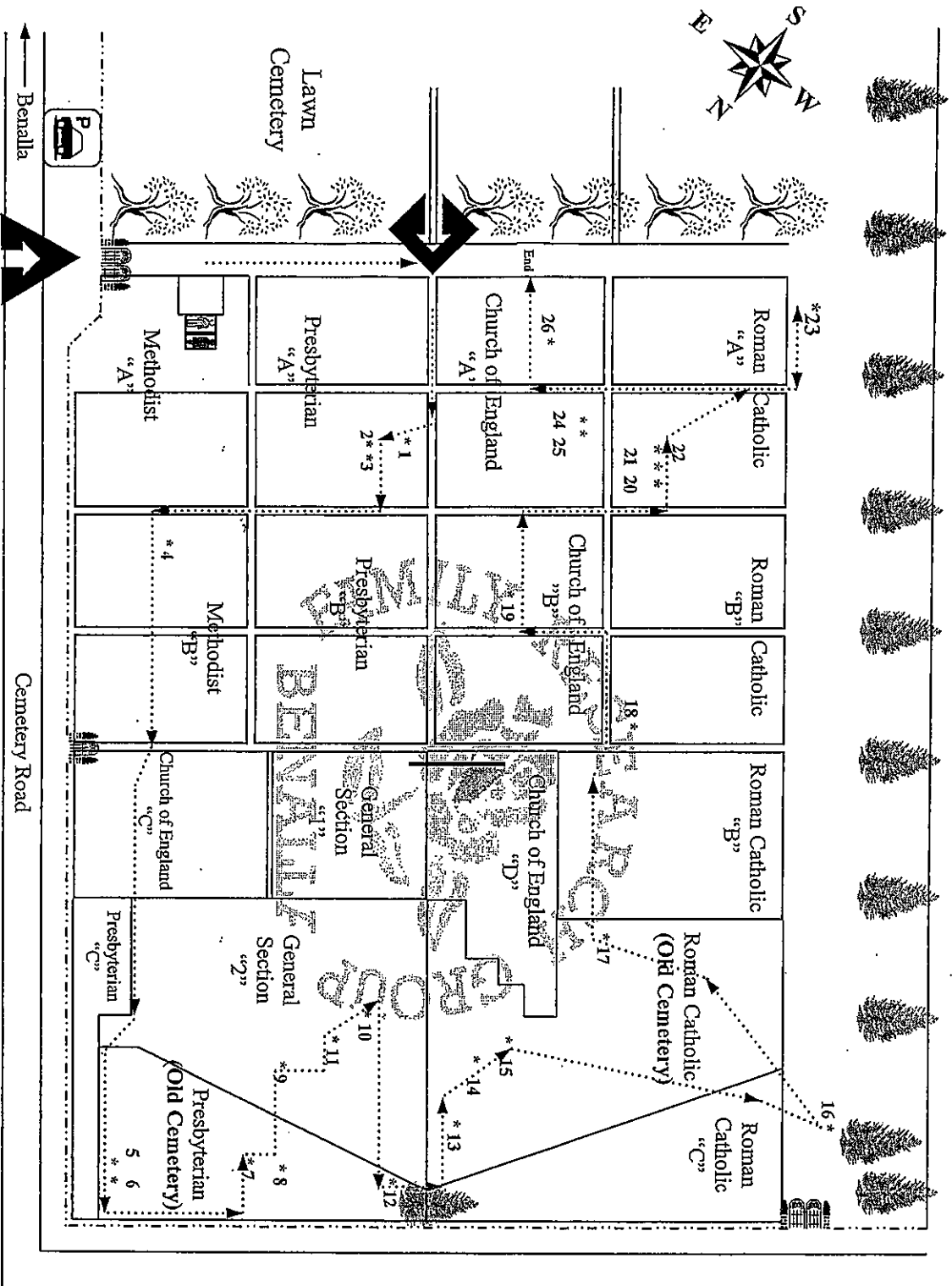
